ASK YOUR PHARMACIST

Head lice and their treatment

with Christine Bender-Pototzki

The nightmare of many parents: head lice! They are tiny wingless parasitic insects, that live in human hair and feed on extremely small amounts of blood drawn from the scalp. They vary in colour from greyish white to brown and though very small, lice can be seen by the naked eye. They are the size of a pinhead when hatched and of a sesame seed when fully grown. A head lice infestation is not the result of dirty hair or poor hygiene and is certainly nothing to be ashamed about. Head lice like to set up home in a warm head of human hair and have no preference for the type of hair, be it brunette or blonde, straight or curly, head lice are not fussy. There is only one way for to pass them from one individual to another. This is by head to head contact, climbing from the hair of an infected person to the hair of someone else. Head lice cannot jump, hop or fly and they only affect humans. So, they cannot be passed on to animals or be caught from them.

Lice aren't dangerous, but they are contagious and can just be downright annoying. It's wise to treat head lice quickly once the diagnosis is made. Itching is the main symptom of head lice. It is not caused by the insect biting the scalp but by an allergy to the lice. However, not everyone experiences itching. Due to their size, colour and rapid movement, head lice are difficult to see. The eggs, creamy brown, are a little easier to spot and will be found attached to individual hairs, often close to the root. In contrast the white empty eggshells (nits) can often be seen further from the scalp.

Detection combing is the best way of finding head lice. This involves using a special fine-toothed comb and maybe a magnifying glass. Detection combing works better on wet hair, but can be used on dry hair.

After a head lice infestation has been confirmed, you can treat the head lice at home by wet combing the hair using a head lice comb or by using medicated lotions or shampoos. Medicated lice treatments are suitable for children over 2 years of age. They usually kill the lice and nits, but it may take a few days for the itching to stop. It is important to follow the directions exactly, because these products are insecticides.

The normal advice is to treat the hair and scalp and to repeat the treatment after 7 days to kill any newly hatched eggs. After treatment it is advisable to comb out dead lice and eggs with a fine-toothed comb. Always seek advice of a health professional before using medicated head lice products on young children under 2, pregnant women and people with asthma or allergies. 



Senator Daly reports...

KENMARE NEW HOSPITAL ROOF NEARS COMPLETION

The roofing contractor is now near completing the necessary fixings for the steel cladding to the roof. The total time frame for this phase of the building project was less than 2 months. This follows the finalising of the block work by Kevin McAllen Building Service (k.mcallen@live.ie) before the start of the summer. With the cladding now almost finished, the electrical, plumbing and plastering of both the internal and external walls is due to begin in the coming weeks.

KENMARE TOURIST OFFICE TO GET EXTRA STAFF AND OPEN LONGER FOLLOWING REPRESENTATIONS BY SENATOR MARK DALY

Following concerns raised by a number of businesses in the area and due to representations made to Failte Ireland, I can confirm that a staff member has been transferred from another Tourist Information Office to work in the Kenmare Tourist Office. On the 6th of August an intern from the European Careers Evolution started and will be in place until mid October 2012. As a result of these

developments, the Kenmare Tourist Office will now function on a six-day week basis for the remainder of the 2012 tourist season. Prior to this, the office was open 5 days a week and had 1 staff member. I welcome these developments in the current economic climate, the key to securing a prosperous future for the area lies in ensuring visitors are informed of the amenities, accommodation and restaurants available to them.

KILGARVAN GRAVEYARD

The Council has recently had discussions with a landowner about the acquisition of further land in Kilgarvan for use as a graveyard.

The Council in the interim intends to use as much space as possible within the existing graveyard.

There are almost 200 unused plots, some with and some without rock, in the north-western quarter of the cemetery, while there are a further 48 spaces available along the southern boundary wall.

Twenty seven graves, which represent an average of less than 6 spaces per year, have been sold by the Council in this cemetery over the last 5 years.

The presence of rock in the ground, coupled with some minor drainage issues, are causing difficulties.

RENEWED THREAT TO THE FUTURE OF THE VALENTIA COAST GUARD STATION

In a country that relies on the safety of locals and visitors who enjoy our waters and our mountains for hiking the renewed threat to the Valentia Coast Guard Station is of serious concern. The station coordinated 164 rescues on both land and sea by the Kerry Mountain Rescue and Coast Guard Helicopter in 2011. I recently went on

Radio Kerry to discuss the renewed threat to the future of the Coast Guards Marine Rescue Centre on Valentia. The reoccurrence of this threat is a worrying development after the previous hard fought campaign to save the centre from closure. In September I aim to have officials from the Department of Transport come before TD's and Senators to answer questions on this matter.

PRESENTATION OF CERTIFICATE OF IRISH HERITAGE BY AMBASSADORS TO ROSES

It was a pleasure to host the 32 Roses participating in this year's Rose of Tralee festival when they visited Leinster House. The roses enjoyed a tour of Leinster House including the Dail and Seanad chambers. I was also delighted to be able to arrange for Certificates of Irish Heritage to be presented to the Roses by their respective Ambassadors. The Certificate is available to any person of Irish ancestry. It was an honour to see the descendants of those who left our shores and who come back as Roses being presented with their Certificate of Irish Heritage.

The Juvenile Fishing Competition held on Looscaunagh Lake by Kenmare Trout Anglers Club this August 12th was a great success. Plenty of young anglers and their parents, with a barbecue to finish off the days fishing. Luckily for all concerned the day stayed dry which was wonderful. How many years have the club run this competition? I do not know but I fished in it myself over sixty years ago.

In those days the now derelict pub, which is sad to see at the side of the lake, was run by the McCarthy family. Mrs McCarthy and her daughters used to delight in looking after us young anglers. Tea, sandwiches and lemonade were the order of the day so, not alone had we the attraction of a lake brimming with trout, but we were fed as well. A group of us used to cycle up there several times a year and were always assured of a big welcome and a basket of fish.

Some days out in particular are stuck in my memory. There is the one on which we got a lift from Denis Kidney RIP, who was the father of Denis Bernard also sadly gone from us. He was a carpenter by trade, but he was employed as a teacher in the days before technical schools. Going to towns and villages, into old sheds, parish halls, giving classes in woodworking skills. The family were neighbours of mine up Rock Street and I remember him heading off on a bicycle around the ring and down to Dingle. It would take him all week. I can tell you he earned his wages and I am sure it was the cause of damaging his health because he died a reasonably young man. However, trying to carry a bag of heavy tools, a change of clothing etc on a bicycle proved too much and he saved up enough money to purchase a big black car with running boards from the front to the back mudguards. It was in good enough condition but for a clutch fault which, until he could get it repaired, meant that it would only be able to change gears when the car was driving. This necessitated parking on hills that the car could roll off and definitely not stopping on level ground. For several weeks before he could get the car repaired he gave a few of us a lift up to Looscaunagh but, and it was big but, he could not stop to let us off or pick us up!

The system we worked out was coming up to McCarthy's Bar he would slow the car to crawling speed, we would open the doors, stand on the running boards and jump off. Picking us up he would start blowing the cars horn once he sighted the lake to warn us to be ready, then open the passenger door and at crawl speed pass the pub. The first of us onboard opened the back door for the rest of us (sometime six) to pile in. It was the highlight of the day and great fun. What the present day health and safety authority would think of this carry on I dread to think, but we saw nothing wrong with it and were delighted with the spin in the car.

Another day we brought a kettle with us and, in an attempt to copy the older anglers, lit a fire. We sent Tony down to the lake to fill the kettle with water and it was soon boiling merrily. A few spoons of tea leaves and job done. We all swore it was the nicest tea ever drank until Dessie went to refill the kettle, and there staring up at him from under the water at the very spot where Tony had got his first fill was a poor dead sheep dog with a big stone tied around his neck. By the look of him he was there for quite a while. I still get ill just thinking about it, I can tell you we were not the better of that day out for a long time. How quickly the years have gone by, but it was fantastic to see the enthusiasm of young anglers enjoying a day out fishing. Long may it continue.

The weather is so atrocious that if you were a duck I am sure you would drown. As a matter of fact I have come to the conclusion that most of the fish have drowned as well. Sea and fresh water fishing are very bad but things can only improve, at least that is what anglers are consoling themselves by thinking at the moment. However with just a few weeks left in the season a change in the current weather would be most welcome by everyone.

Want to know what your dog is thinking?

Meghan Kestler-Tobias, Expert Dog Behaviourist, teachings are based on the



philosophy of natural dog behaviour and psychology. What exactly does this mean? Simply put, it is the art of learning how dogs naturally behave amongst one another in order to communicate with the dog in its own language. Many people try to get their dogs to understand human communication so they can continue to act human and communicate human towards the dog. Dogs are less complicated than humans and while it is difficult and sometimes impossible to make a dog understand human, humans can learn the language of the dog if they open their minds to the idea. You must work with the natural instincts of the animal, not against them. Because dogs are so closely bonded with the human species, most humans forget, or never even think about, their natural instincts. Dogs want structure, rules, and boundaries. They want to know where they stand amongst their pack. They want to know the rules and they need consistency with those rules. All dog behavior issues stem from humans who are not aware of their dog's needs, from exercise, both mental and physical, to the leadership it craves. What something means to a human may mean the complete opposite to a dog. A dog's temperament is a direct result of the owner's ability to understand him and give him what he instinctively needs as a canine animal. There are no bad dogs...just uneducated owners. Canine psychology classes start soon!

Kenmare After School Club is a great asset for people who need quality after school care for children who are of primary school age. This is a fantastic facility for parents who want to work, study, attend appointments or simply go shopping without the need to collect their children from school. It is a huge benefit to the community providing children with social, recreational and development activities outside of school hours in a friendly, safe, and stimulating environment where they are constantly supervised. Children attending the After School Club are collected from Kenmare National School and walked safely to the Club, which is based in a large, bright room at the Atlantic Lodge. Once at the club they are given a snack before homework is supervised. Then they can participate in arts and crafts, educational and team games, play with our varied educational toys (modeling, construction, puzzles, etc) or simply relax in our library area. We do have the occasional movie afternoon too.

The Club is open during term time from 2pm - 6pm Monday - Friday. Children are collected from Kenmare N.S. at 2pm and 3pm and if the school closes early for any reason or if there is an inservice day then the After School Club will be open to coincide with this. If your child does not attend Kenmare N.S. then you can drop them into us. You can either book full weekly sessions or just Play, Stay and Pay by the hour. Later hours can be pre-booked if necessary if you want to collect your child after 6pm (at an additional cost). All children need to be pre-booked and pre-registered before they can attend so please contact us to book a place for your child as spaces are limited.

She raised an amazing 450 on the night and is pictured here presenting the cheque to Josephine O'Neill and members of the Defibrillator Group. A big thank you from Shirley and all the Defibrillator Group to everyone who donated so generously to the project.

Four Defibrillators have been purchased recently and are located at Spillanes Bar, Blackwater Tavern, John Sheehans Garage Direen and Dromore Sportsfield. There is a 5th Defibrillator at Templenoe GAA Grounds. 36 members of the community are now trained in CPR & use of the Defibrillator; further training will take place

in October so anyone interested should give in their names now. Training takes only 4 hours and costs 25. The four recently purchased Defibrillators and accessories cost in the region of 8, 700. The money was all raised locally, 3,000 by the Blackwater Drama Group, 1,000 by the GAA at Charity Matches and 4,700 was borrowed from the Blackwater Women's Group. Defibrillator Group applied to South Kerry Development Partnership for funding and hope to recieve 75% funding later this year. There are on going maintenance costs with Defibrillators; pads for delivering a shock have to be replaced every two years and batteries need to be replaced every four years. All those trained can collect a key to the Defibrillator boxes at Blackwater Tavern, a list of everyone trained will also be availeable at Blackwater Tavern.

Bridgestone Guide declares Kenmare Food Carnival 'a keeper!'

Joe McNames from the prestigious Bridgestone Guide has extolled the virtues of Kenmare Food Carnival in their latest report..

"The man from the local enterprise board is congratulating Kenmare Food Carnival Chairperson Karen Coakley, "You've gone past stages one and two and you've started the festival at stage three," says he.

Possibly, he is marvelling at perceived chutzpah or downright brass neck while food festivals proliferate all around the country at a fiercesome rate, the advice is always to start slowly, develop organically over a number of years. Not Kenmare. Mind you, Kenmare has being 'doing food' for decades, so far ahead of the national curve as to be almost deserving of some class of independent culinary statehood.

The thumb first brought me to Kenmare, almost thirty years ago and does so again today albeit, this time, pressing phone keys for a spot of 'twitchhiking' rather than several hours of old school hitchhiking. But skipping out of the car at the top of the town, the initial sensation remains the same as it always does on arrival here: giddy, childlike excitement; where, oh where to begin?! We begin the gentle tumble down the length of a swarming Main St, tourists and locals alike, blinking in the glorious sun, drawn out from whatever dark corners they have spent the preceding months sheltering from the ongoing National Deluge. Down we amble, past the shops and pubs, all en fete, sporting the colourful Carnival livery, down we head towards the beating heart, the farmer's market, at the bottom of the hill, by the Square. No better place to take the festival's pulse and all the vital signs are very encouraging

Carlos Luque, the original chef at Cork's Boqueria is almost completely cleaned out of tapas yet the market still has another six hours to run. First bite of his spicy crab on roast pepper with mashed potato is explanation enough: succulent, sweet crab on meaty red pepper encircled in piped creamy mash potato. He is still sorely missed in Cork.

Benoit Lorge is selling some of his exquisite chocolate and confectionary in between reconnaisance missions wearing his other hat as one of the festival committee. There's a guy doing fair impression of Crocodile Dundee knocking out barbecued kangaroo skewers and a little further down the line, underneath the cool, inviting folds of what could be a bedouin tent as much as a market stall, is a banquet of vegetarian treats.

It is a lovely mix of stallholders. 'Blow-ins', Ballyhoura Mushrooms, Annie's Roasts, BBQ Joes, dotted about amongst an equally sterling selection of 'locals', St Tola Goat's Cheese, Strawberry Field. A great big red double decker bus And everywhere there is seafood —in Kenmare, they have long realised the sea is more than just a handy place to park your yacht. There are three or four stands offering cooked mussels, oysters 'balming out' on beds of ice; the fish man is cleaned out almost as quickly as Carlos.

Back up the town, onto Henry St, the real 'culinary quarter', tables are set up outside selling little tasters of the wares on offer in the myriad food establishments along the way. Jam's stall, across from their premises, down an alleyway, is 'manned' by a woman in a pink Edwardian frock and bonnet as fetching as the cupcakes before her.

More seafood outside Packies, a delicious yet plaintive reminder that chef Martin Hallissey is out of town for the weekend at a wedding and won't be open for business that evening.

Gerry O'Shea lounges in the sun outside his Prego restaurant which becomes a de facto Field Kitchen for recovering revellers over the weekend. He and chef Tamsin are manning a stall of venison sausage tapas, the proceeds in

this case going to cancer research. "The recession maybe caught a few people in the town on the hop," says Gerry, "but" He's content to leave the picture before us, heaving throngs of locals and tourists alike, moving from stall to stall, like slowly grazing cattle, to complete his sentiment. Upstairs in the Skyline Gallery, Christian from the Sheen Falls kitchen doles out some delicious salmon to nibble while taking in some lovely food-themed photos by Mike O'Toole and Eoin Kavanagh.

Kate O'Shea from Nom Nom Café stands with a coffee in one hand and a glass of one in the other ('a tasting across the road,' she indicates with a broad wink) hymning the praises of her own beetroot pate and cheesecake brownies; a nibble or two and we're joining in on the chorus.

In the Pobail Scoil, they've set up a theatre for cooking demos. Everyone from the bloggerati - Helena Moloney (Helenaskitchen), Niamh Sheils (eatlikeagirl), Yvonne Carty (heypesto) - to Martijn Kajuiter, and Darina herself does a turn. And everyone of them very generously donates their services for the inaugural festival.

As evening sets in, a jazz band takes to the park stage in the Square. Over the railings the lovely old time carnival comes into its own, lights twinkling in the dusk, a soundtrack of hurdy-gurdy organ and childish squeals of delight pealing off into the night air.

Some of the flagship festival events are on tonight, festival banquets courtesy of chef Bruce Mulcahy at the Park Hotel and chef Heiko at Sheen Falls Lodge, while chef James Mulchrone is doing a special pop-up banquet at Jam. But late arrival and high demand means we find ourselves 'off-piste' in Prego again, this time for a pizza. The waitress is highly intrigued by my choice of toppings so I offer her a piece. She takes it. Prego is that kind of place. It's late enough when we leave but, in Kenmare, that's 'round about when the night begins.

The Kenmare Food Carnival is a keeper - see you here next year!"

DO YOU SUFFER FROM INFLAMMATION?

Inflammation is a natural reaction to injury or infection. Affected tissues swell, redden, become warm and tender and may be painful. A second step is to avoid or reduce red meats, dairy and refined carbohydrates such as white flour, rolls white rice, sugar, and soft drinks etc.

Ouestion

I will be 65 in October and retiring from work. I will be applying for a State Pension based on my PRSI contributions. I heard that the rates of payment have been reduced. Will I get less than my husband is getting at the moment?

Answer

At the moment you get the full rate of pension if you have a yearly average of 48 or more PRSI contributions. However, people with a reduced average of 20-47 PRSI contributions per year over their working life receive a weekly State Pension of only 4.50 less.

From September 2012 a lower pension will be payable to new applicants who have a yearly average of less than 48 PRSI contributions. The new rates are in the following table:



Roads







We are not going to mention the weather at all this month! no point, water under the bridge, so to speak! But it can only get better. And, with that in mind let's see what can be done to help brighten up this coming Autumn and winter. Planning for this needs to start over the next few weeks.

- 1. To help green up the lawn apply some Lawn feed with moss and weed killer. This will help with the colour of a well washed out lawn, help to knock back the moss and weeds and will have the lawn in a slightly better health going into the winter.
- 2. Summer containers can all do with feeding whenever you can as so much goodness has been washed out of them. A mild autumn could see these containers flowering away well into the end of October if they are encouraged with some Tomato feed. Geraniums and petunias have certainly suffered from the damp conditions but the Begonia has flowered away no matter how much rain fell on it....could use more of these next summer.
- 3. If you need some instant colour in the garden Hydrangea and Hebes can provide a great splash of practically wet weather resistant colour. The Hydrangea in particular does very well in wet conditions. For adding colour to window boxes and other containers the late summer flowering Heathers will provide colour from now into October. For larger containers, a garden

chrysanthemum, a "Garden 'Mum", can fill a large pot all on its own providing an instant splash of colour.

EARLY AUTUMN PLANS

So, now these problems are fixed we have to look forward to the autumn and winter.

- 1. The lawn should be greening up slowly, just keep it well mown whenever it is dry enough to mow and rake off falling leaves when you get a chance. If they are left lie for too long they will only encourage the moss.
- 2. Bulb planting time will begin from early September through to November. The bulbs that you can plant up during this period will provide spring flowers from the early crocus, iris and Daffodils in February through to the later Tulips varieties that will keep the colour going into April.
- Winter Pansy and Violas will be available by early September for planting out into containers or beds. These plant provide colour in autumn and early winter and come to life again very quickly as the
- weather warms up in early spring. Well worth planting.

 4. Autumn planting of fruit trees is recommended so that some root growth can take place before winter sets in. This will give the trees an early advantage next spring when growth starts up again.
- Likewise a lot of trees and shrubs will benefit from autumn planting especially if there is mild weather well into November like normal. Bare root hedging can not be planted until late November, after the
- 6. Make sure that newly planted trees are well secured for the beginning of the Autumn gales that will begin in September. Trees have all grown well in the wet summer and have a relatively large canopy of leaves that will be blown and battered by the wind and may need extra staking for support.






